Springfield Public School Team Wins MN State Regional Science Bowl for Middle School Students

Will compete in National Finals in Washington, D.C.

Minneapolis, MN – Springfield Public School won the Minnesota Academy of Science's 2nd Annual Minnesota State Regional Science Bowl for Middle School Students on Saturday, February 21, 2009. The Civility Award is presented to the coach and team, which best represents the positive aspects of competition, whether winning or losing.
